

POLICE & CRIME PLAN FOR SUFFOLK

Suffolk's latest Police and Crime Plan, for the period to March 2029, builds upon the work undertaken since I was first elected in 2012. The Plan, which is set out in three themes, outlines the activity which will be delivered by my office and the Constabulary.

Policing plays a crucial role in making Suffolk a safe place in which to live, work, travel and invest. Beyond dealing with crime, good policing supports crime prevention, helps economic growth and feelings of safety. I want a relentless focus on keeping Suffolk safe, bringing criminals to justice and supporting victims of crime.

Suffolk is a great county and we have a strong Constabulary which works hard to protect us and keep us safe. Suffolk now has more police officers than ever before, which is great news for the county. The latest Office for National Statistics data shows we have the third lowest recorded crime rate per person in England and Wales.

It is an enormous privilege to hold this public service role in Suffolk – a wonderful county, where I was born and have lived all my life.

For me, Suffolk's interests will always come first.
