DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION

1. KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION:

- 1.1 The attached request seeks an extension to the Joint Athena Hub Section 22A Collaboration Agreement to enable the department to continue to fully collaborate pending completion of the wider review of the Joint ACC command structure that encompasses both Joint Justice Services and the Joint Athena Hub.
- 1.2 The current Joint Athena Hub Section 22A Collaboration Agreement is due to expire 30 June 2025. An extension to the Agreement is proposed for a period of 12 months and until 30 June 2026.
- 1.3 A review of the ACC Command structure is ongoing to ensure that efficiency and effectiveness are maximised, and the collaboration is delivering the value for money expected.
- 1.4 It is anticipated that the Joint Athena function will be incorporated into the revised structure rather than operating as a separate function. This extension will cover the period required to complete the review and transfer the function.
- 1.5 A new overarching Section 22A Agreement that encompasses both Joint Justice Services and the Joint Athena Hub will be drafted following completion of the review, reflecting the structural changes, and circulated for signing in due course.


