## SUMMARY:

1. The Police and Crime Commissioner can commission services that:

- a) secure, or contribute to securing, crime and disorder reduction in Suffolk;
- b) are intended to help victims or witnesses of, or other persons affected by, offences and anti-social behaviour.

This is in accordance with the provisions in the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. In applying this provision, the PCC will ensure that the services commissioned are also consistent with the Suffolk Police and Crime Plan 2013 – 2017.

- 2. The PCC's Safer Suffolk Fund was established in February 2014 to support organisations that can contribute to delivering the Police and Crime Plan objectives. The fund became operational on 1 April 2014.
- 3. A Grant Panel was established to consider applications and make recommendations on grant awards to the PCC who determines every grant award.
- 4. This decision paper sets out the recommendations following the ninth and tenth grant panels. Eleven applications are recommended for funding from the Safer Suffolk Fund totalling £169,446.

### RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the PCC endorses the grants awarded through the Safer Suffolk Fund.

## **DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION**

# 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner can commission services that:
  - a. secure, or contribute to securing, crime and disorder reduction in Suffolk;
  - b. are intended to help victims or witnesses of, or other persons affected by, offences and anti-social behaviour.

This is in accordance with the provisions in the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. In applying this provision, the PCC will ensure that the services commissioned are also consistent with the Suffolk Police and Crime Plan 2013 – 2017.

1.2 This report provides a summary of the grants recommended for funding by the Safer Suffolk Fund Grant Panel during rounds nine and ten of grant making (see Appendix A).

### 2. SAFER SUFFOLK FUND

- 2.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner established the Safer Suffolk Fund to be administered by Suffolk Community Foundation. More information on the Safer Suffolk Fund can be found on the PCC website: <a href="Decision 10 2014 Proposals for Crime and Disorder Reduction Grants 2014-15">Decision 10 2014 Proposals for Crime and Disorder Reduction Grants 2014-15</a> and the <a href="Safer Suffolk Fund Terms">Safer Suffolk Fund Terms</a> of <a href="Reference">Reference</a>. <a href="Decision 23-2016">Decision 23-2016</a> refers to the future management of small grant awards.
- 2.2 The Safer Suffolk Fund seeks to support organisations that can show clear measurable outcomes that address the key objectives of the Police and Crime Plan for Suffolk 2013-2017. These are: to respond to emergencies, solve crime, prevent and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour, and care for victims and vulnerable people.
- 2.3 It is recognised that voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations play a significant role in tackling issues associated with these objectives and therefore the fund seeks applications from organisations that provide support in the following priority areas:
  - Vulnerable people
  - Victims of crime
  - Domestic violence and abuse
  - Mental health
  - Substance misuse
  - Supporting families
  - Creating a safer night-time economy
  - Offending and reoffending
  - Anti-social behaviour
- 2.4 A panel, established to consider grant applications of over £3,500, includes a representative of the PCC's executive team and Chairs of all the local Community Safety Partnerships (Ipswich, West Suffolk, Suffolk Coastal and Waveney Community Safety Partnerships). The Panel is chaired by the PCC who is responsible for final determination of each award. Applications for £3,500 or less are determined by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC).

2.5 The following PCC decisions refer to previous Safer Suffolk Fund awards:

PCC Decision 3-2015 - grants awarded between 1 April and 31 December 2014 (Rounds 1 and 2)

PCC Decision 30-2015 - grants awarded between 1 January and 31 March 2015 (Round 3).

PCC Decision 40-2015 - grants awarded at the panel meeting of July 2015 (Round 4).

<u>PCC Decision 8 - 2016</u> – grants awarded at the panel meetings of November 2015 and February 2016 (Rounds 5 and 6).

PCC Decision 28 - 2016 - grants awarded at the panel meeting of May 2016 (Round 7)

PCC Decision 47-2016 – grants awarded at the panel meeting of September 2016 (Round 8)

### 3. PROPOSED GRANTS FOR FUNDING

- 3.1 Details of the eleven grants proposed by the Grant Panel can be found in Appendix A.
- 3.2 Conditions, including monitoring arrangements, for each award are agreed between Suffolk Community Foundation and the recipient.

## 4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 The recommended grants from rounds 9 and 10 of the panel total £169,446 (see appendix A).
- 4.2 The total amount of awards made from the PCC's Safer Suffolk Fund during the 2016-17 financial year (grant rounds 7 to 10) was £344,801.

5.1 There are no major implications or risks associated with this decision paper.
