SUMMARY OF SAFER SUFFOLK FUND GRANTS – 1 APRIL – 31 DECEMBER 2014

### SUMMARY:

1. The Police and Crime Commissioner can commission services that:

a) secure, or contribute to securing, crime and disorder reduction in Suffolk;

b) are intended to help victims or witnesses of, or other persons affected by, offences and anti-social behaviour.

This is in accordance with the provisions in the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. In applying this provision, the PCC will ensure that the services commissioned are also consistent with the Suffolk Police and Crime Plan 2013 – 2017.

- 2. The Safer Suffolk Fund was established in February 2014 by the Suffolk PCC to support organisations that can contribute to delivering the Police and Crime Plan objectives. The fund became operational on 1 April 2014.
- 3. A Grant Panel was established to consider applications and make recommendations on grant awards to the PCC who determines every grant award. Within the period 1 April to 31 December 2014, the Panel recommended eleven applications for funding from the Safer Suffolk Fund totalling £141,635.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

The PCC endorses the grants awarded through the Safer Suffolk Fund.

# **DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION**

### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner can commission services that:
  - a. secure, or contribute to securing, crime and disorder reduction in Suffolk;
  - b. are intended to help victims or witnesses of, or other persons affected by, offences and anti-social behaviour.

This is in accordance with the provisions in the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. In applying this provision, the PCC will ensure that the services commissioned are also consistent with the Suffolk Police and Crime Plan 2013 – 2017.

1.2 This report provides a summary of the grants recommended by the Safer Suffolk Fund Grant Panel between 1 April and 31 December 2014 (see Appendix A).

## 2. SAFER SUFFOLK FUND

- 2.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner established the Safer Suffolk Fund to be administered by Suffolk Community Foundation. More information on the Safer Suffolk Fund can be found in <u>Decision 10 2014 Proposals for Crime and Disorder</u> Reduction Grants 2014-15 and the Safer Suffolk Fund Terms of Reference.
- 2.2 The Safer Suffolk Fund seeks to support organisations that can show clear measurable outcomes that address the key objectives of the Police and Crime Plan for Suffolk 2013-2017. These are: to respond to emergencies, solve crime, prevent and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour, and care for victims and vulnerable people.
- 2.3 It is recognised that voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations play a significant role in tackling issues associated with these objectives and therefore the fund is seeking applications from organisations that are providing support in the following priority areas:
  - Vulnerable people
  - Victims of crime
  - Domestic violence and abuse
  - Mental health
  - Substance misuse
  - Supporting families
  - Creating a safer night-time economy
  - Offending and reoffending
  - Anti-social behaviour
- 2.4 Two Grant Panels have so far been convened to consider grant applications. Membership of the Panel includes a representative of the PCC's executive team and Chairs of all the local Community Safety Partnerships (Ipswich, West Suffolk, Suffolk Coastal and Waveney Community Safety Partnerships). The Panel is chaired by the PCC who is responsible for final determination of each award.
- 2.5 Between 1 April and 31 December 2014, the Grant Panel considered 24 applications in total and recommended eleven applications for funding.

# 3. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUNDING

- 3.1 Details of the grants recommended for funding by the Grant Panel and approved by the PCC can be found in Appendix A.
- 3.2 Conditions, including monitoring arrangements, for each award have been agreed between Suffolk Community Foundation with the recipient.

## 4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The total amount of the Safer Suffolk Fund for 2014/15 is £300,000. The eleven grants awarded between 1 April and 31 December 2014 totalled £141,635 leaving £158,364 of the fund unallocated at that date.
