DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION

1. KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION:

- 1.1 Following the transition of the Association of Chief Police Officers (ACPO) to the National Police Chiefs' Council (NPCC) a national need was identified to find a delivery model for the ACRO Criminal Records Office and which had originally operated under ACPO. It has been arranged for the service to be delivered under a lead force model and a collaboration agreement under Section 22A of the Police Act 1997.
- 1.2 Opportunity has now been provided to all required signatories, namely chief officers of police and local policing bodies, to comment upon draft documentation and approval is now sought to execute the final version of the collaboration agreement.

2. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

2.1 The funding will be provided by the constituent local policing bodies on the basis of a formula spending share allocation. In Suffolk's case this will be 0.8%.

GENERAL:

3.1 The arrangements for the delivery model are detailed in the collaboration agreement. Governance is essentially provided via a nationally appointed governance board.

4. OTHER IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS:

4.1 The collaboration agreement has been considered generally with the Chief Constable and also from a legal perspective. It is considered both appropriate and necessary for effective service delivery that the agreement is executed.
