DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 At a meeting of the Police and Crime Commissioners (PCCs) and Chief Constables (CCs) for Norfolk and Suffolk on 28 January 2013, it was agreed that the Collaboration Strategy of the former Police Authorities should be revised to reflect the position held by each PCC and CC on collaboration between the two police areas.
- 1.2 The Norfolk and Suffolk Collaboration Panel on 26 April 2013 considered a draft Collaboration Strategy which was agreed in principle subject to further amendment to reflect points arising from discussion at the meeting. The Panel agreed that the final wording of the Strategy be agreed by officers outside the meeting. The revised draft Strategy has been circulated to Panel members and no further changes made.
- 1.3 The Strategy outlines the collaborative vision for the Norfolk and Suffolk police areas. It provides the strategic framework within which to progress collaborative opportunities and governance principles for the programme. The Collaboration Strategy is submitted for the formal approval of the Police and Crime Commissioner.
- 1.4 The Strategy will be published on the PCC's website and on the Intranets of both Constabularies.
