Ipswich reported crime April to September 2013

- Total crime down 568 offences (-9.2%)
- Burglary dwelling down 69 offences (-12%)
- Robbery down 22 offences (-29%)
- Violence with injury down 74 (-12%)
- Rowdy/Inconsiderate ASB reported incidents down 147 (-6.2%)
- Crime solved rate 36.4% (+0.8%)
