Woodbridge and Felixstowe

Data to end of September 2013

- Total Crime down by 323 offences (16% reduction)
- Burglary Dwelling down by 32 offences (32% reduction)
- Robbery down by 3 offences (38% reduction)
- Violence with Injury down by 12 offences (7% reduction)





Woodbridge and Felixstowe

Data to end of September 2013

- Overall Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) down by 380 reported incidents (20% reduction)
- Rowdy/Inconsiderate ASB down by 270 reported incidents (27% reduction)
- Overall solved rate - Woodbridge and Felixstowe - 31.8%
