Question 1. To what extent is speeding a problem in the area where you live, on a scale of 1 to 5?	Response
No problem 1	13% (3/23)
2	9% (2/23)
3	43% (10/23)
4	22% (5/23)
Big problem 5	13% (3/23)

Question 2. To what extent do you agree with the following statement: "There should be more enforcement of speed limits"?	Response
Strongly agree 1	35% (8/23)
2	9% (2/23)
3	26% (6/23)
4	26% (6/23)
Strongly disagree 5	4% (1/23)

Question 3. In general do you think there are certain areas where there should be more or less speed enforcement? (free text)

The main areas identified for more speed enforcement were villages (9/23), urban/towns (4/23) and schools (2/23)

Question 4. Which of the following do you think are effective in dealing with speeding in your area? (free text) Respondents were able to select more than one option.

Traffic calming (such as speed humps)	43% (10/23)
Community speed watch programmes	39% (9/23)
Speed guns	39% (9/23)
Speed limits	30% (7/23)
Speed cameras	17% (4/23)
Other	26% (6/23)

In terms of 'Other' the issues raised were:

Speed Indicator Display (SID); Campaigns in schools; Reduce speed limits; Education and awareness; More traffic police and road mounted speed activated stingers.
