



Suffolk Show Results:

213 people answered the survey at the Suffolk Show, the number of respondents to each question is indicated.

Question 1. To what extent is speeding a problem in the area where you live, on a scale of 1 to 5?	Response
1 - No problem	13.6% (29/213)
2	18.3% (39/213)
3	23.5% (50/213)
4	25.4% (54/213)
5 - Big problem	19.2% (41/213)

Question 2. To what extent do you agree with the following statement: "There should be more enforcement of speed limits"?	Response
1- Strongly agree	37.6% (80/213)
2	16.9% (36/213)
3	25.4% (54/213)
4	8.5% (18/213)
5 - Strongly disagree	11.7% (25/213)

Question 3. In general do you think there are certain areas where there should be more, or less, speed enforcement? (free text)

- 21.6% (44/204) said that more enforcement is needed around schools
- 17.6% (36/204) believe there should be more enforcement in residential and built-up areas such as town centres
- 15.2% (31/204) said that villages require more enforcement, particularly due to a lack of footpaths, higher speed limits on the approach to villages and the potential for children to be playing nearby
- 6.4% (13/204) think there should be less enforcement on dual carriageways and main roads, however 2.9% (6/204) people believe that more is required on the main roads such as the Copdock Interchange and A1406.
- 4% (13/204) said that various speed limits should be increased. "Open stretches of 30mph are too extreme. On the A140 there is 30-40-50."
- 1.4% (3/204) also mentioned that speed limits should be reduced.

Question 4. Which of the following do you think are effective in dealing with speeding in your area? (free text)

Respondents thought speed cameras, speed guns and traffic calming such as speed bumps were effective in dealing with speeding in their area:

- speed cameras 48.8% (104/213)
 - speed guns 45.5% (97/213)
 - speed bumps 41.8% (89/213)

- 31.5% (67/213) think speed limits are effective
 - 25.8% (55/213) think Community Speed Watch programmes are effective
 - 'Other' methods suggested: Vehicle Activated Signs 5.6% (12/213) and an 'increase in police presence 4.7% (10/12).
