

## SUFFOLK COASTAL COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP FUNDING 2013/14

<p><b>FEARLESS</b></p> <p><u>Aim:</u> To take the Fearless Project (Crimestoppers) into two high schools aimed at 11-16 year olds to feature a drama workshop targeting issues relating to risk taking behaviour and ASB and the dangers of Alcohol and Drugs misuse</p> <p><u>Progress:</u> Two schools have been identified and the drama production is currently being reviewed. A similar programme has been run in previous years at Felixstowe with excellent feedback from pupils and staff.</p> <p><u>Outcomes:</u> To increase knowledge and awareness amongst young people about the consequences of risk taking behaviour and participating in criminal activity and where young people can obtain and give information safely through the Fearless website. Crimestoppers evaluation report will include number of unique visits to the website from Suffolk Coastal District, number of followers on facebook, twitter etc. Number of arrests and charges, and other sanction detections reported by the Police as a result of information received.</p>	£3,000	January 2014	Night Time Economy Young People/Vulnerable Families
<p><b>CRUCIAL CREW</b></p> <p><u>Aim:</u> Delivered through YR6 (9-10 yr old) to sensitise children to emergency and/or dangerous situations by working with the Police, Red Cross, Fire Services, Healthy Living, Road Safety and Train Safety. This project is already running successfully in Waveney, Bury St. Edmunds and Ipswich.</p> <p><u>Progress:</u> Dates have been selected and the venue has been booked for October 2013. 30 schools have confirmed attendance from across the whole of the Suffolk Coastal district. Further discussions with partner agencies regarding content of scenarios and materials required are on-going.</p> <p><u>Outcomes:</u> To develop awareness on personal safety and provide a positive role model experience for many children lacking a positive family influence. <p><b>Y-B-Yz</b>  <u>Aim:</u>          To work with all primary schools aimed at YR5 (8-9 yr old) pupils as a precursor to attending Crucial Crew in YR6. This is an interactive workshop using magic and story telling, focussing on good citizenship with themes to highlight consequences of bullying, peer pressure and anti-social behaviour.  <u>Progress:</u>          Currently in discussion regarding dates and making contact with schools as this project is delivered directly within schools.  <u>Outcomes:</u>          To develop improved educational and awareness raising to young people in terms of the consequences of risk taking behaviour and providing positive role models, guidance and information, on the consequences of ASB and its impact not only on the children but those around them. Evaluation will include the number of schools attending, number of children attending and completion of post evaluation forms by teachers.</p>	£3,500	November 2013- January 2014	Young People/Vulnerable Families
<p><b>KESGRAVE ACTIVITIES</b>  <u>Aim:</u> Following low levels of Anti-social behaviour, Criminal Damage and occasional arson in the Kesgrave area, working with Kesgrave Community Centre and Positive Futures Suffolk to offer multi activities on Tuesday evenings, including street dance, football, dodge ball, boot camp, boxing or self defence, to provide a positive outlet for energies.  <u>Progress:</u>          The project is organised to commence during Autumn 2013.  <u>Outcomes:</u>          Reduced actual and perceived level of Anti-social behaviour, Criminal Damage and occasional arson in the area by 15%. <p><b>STREET SPORT</b>  <u>Aim:</u>          To encourage young people to participate in positive activities in Woodbridge, Felixstowe, Leiston and Rendlesham following reported Anti-social Behaviour</p>	£1,500	July – September 2013	Young People/Vulnerable Families

<p>incidents during the summer months in these areas.</p> <p><u>Progress:</u> Activities in these areas commenced on the 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2013.</p> <p><u>Outcomes:</u> Reduced number of Anti-social behaviour incidents reported during the summer months associated with young people in the identified hotspot areas. Improved quality of life for local communities.</p>			
<p><b>COASTAL ACTION AGAINST ABUSE (CAAA)</b></p> <p><u>Aim:</u> Local delivery of County wide project 'Abuse in a relationship is never ok'. This is aimed at young people of school age across Suffolk Coastal through schools and youth establishments. To provide a positive role model experience through advice and information.</p> <p><u>Progress:</u> Training was completed by 18 practitioners from CYP, YOT, school pastoral care and school nursing staff. The freedom programme is continuing to run in Children's Centres in the Suffolk Coastal area.</p> <p><u>Outcomes:</u> Improve victim and public confidence through the delivery by CAAA and partners of events and campaigns. The number of schools attending and youth establishments engaged in activities targeted to respond addressing domestic abuse in relationships between young people.</p>	£1,000	Ongoing during 2013/14	Young People/Vulnerable Families
<p><b>POLICE CADETS</b></p> <p><u>Aim:</u> To enhance the training of Police cadets to help more disadvantaged cadets at camp. Support a residential activity weekend to increase confidence and skill mix. Currently 25% of cadets are considered 'at risk', vulnerable to either offending or becoming a victim of crime. There is also a significant number of cadets assessed as being in the Autism spectrum.</p> <p><u>Progress:</u> There are currently 25 Cadets in the Suffolk Coastal area. Cadets will supervise and lead on summer activities.</p> <p><u>Outcomes:</u> Much of the evaluation will be judged on the number of young people who engage</p>	£1,000	September 2013	Young People/Vulnerable Families

<b>LICENSING PACKS</b>	£1,120	2013	Night Time Economy
<p><u>Aim:</u> This licensee support pack is designed to assist retailers in responsible retailing and best practise. It adheres to the four main principles of the licensing act: The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, The Prevention of Public Nuisance and The Protection of Children from Harm. The pack is a practical in terms of offering advice and guidance around the many subject headings related to the licensing trade and provides additional information on were to obtain further details on questions that may arise when going through the pack.</p> <p><u>Progress:</u> Packs identified for existing Nightsafe Members (Nightsafe is a partnership involving the Police, Council Licensing Authority and licensees who work together to improve the night-time economy experience and share best practice). The Partnership is waiting for training and further publication of the pack.</p> <p><u>Outcomes:</u> Strengthened links with Night Safe schemes for licensees and partners such as Police and Town Pastors. Reduce the harm caused by excessive drinking through appropriate regulation of alcohol licensing. Improved health and well-being and quality of life for residents, communities and other people accessing the wider early evening and night-time economy environment.</p>			
<b>SAXMUNDHAM ACTIVITIES</b>	£634	July-September 2013	Young People/Vulnerable Families
<p><u>Aim:</u> Provision and delivery of diversionary activities for young people during the summer period in Saxmundham and surrounding villages as there is a known lack of youth activities to prevent anti-social behaviour and criminal activity. Youth workers providing activities will act as a mentor for young people and, as a captive audience, will provide information and advice on health and wellbeing to tackle some of the local issues/problems young people are experiencing.</p> <p><u>Progress:</u> Activities organised and commenced on the 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2013</p> <p><u>Outcomes:</u> Reduce levels of crime and anti-social behaviour. Activity through the engagement of young people in positive &amp; healthy alternernative activities. Young people better informed about leading safer and healthier lifestyles</p>
