

## **CRIME DATA INTEGRITY GROUP**

### **Terms of Reference**

#### **Aim**

The Crime recording, Audit and Crime Data Integrity Group is established to

- Ensure the public can have confidence in the accuracy of police recorded crime data
- Ensure that police leaders are effective in their oversight and assurance of crime data held by Suffolk Constabulary
- Ensure that victims are served well by Suffolk Constabulary when crime recording decisions are made
- Ensure that out of court disposals are the right ones for victims, offenders and the wider public.

#### **Purpose of the Group**

- To ensure full compliance with both the National Crime Recording Standards (NCRS) and the National Standards for Incident Recording (NSIR); continue to develop and refine processes and operating procedures in order to provide an excellent, ethical service and maintain public confidence in Suffolk Constabulary
- To critically examine audit reports produced by both internal and external departments or agencies and to take forward their subsequent recommendations
- To examine good practise from other forces and professional bodies with regards to data integrity
- To provide a forum for departments within the organisation to discuss compliance and emerging issues with regards to crime data integrity
- To provide a consultation capacity to the Constabulary on crime data or recording issues
- To understand and consider the impacts of NCRS and NSIR across the organisation with due regard to any legislative or procedural changes
