PCC grants for victims' services

A key part of the Police & Crime Commissioner's role is to commission services that help reduce demand on the Constabulary.

Each year Suffolk's PCC allocates over £800K to address domestic abuse and sexual violence, this includes funding to Leeway Domestic Violence & Abuse Service to support the Independent Domestic Violence Advisors (IDVA) service.



Suffolk Police & Crime Commissioner's Fund

The Police and Crime Commissioner can award Crime and Disorder Reduction Grants to organisations providing services that contribute to securing crime and disorder reduction in Suffolk. There is an annual £300K PCC Fund, managed by Suffolk Community Foundation, which funds voluntary sector initiatives which support the delivery of Suffolk's Police and Crime Plan.

Grants of between £250 and £20,000 are available to support the work of voluntary and community groups, charities, Social Enterprises and Community Interest Companies who deliver services that help make Suffolk a safer place in which to live, work, travel and invest.

Making an application

Voluntary sector organisations often play a significant role in reducing crime and disorder, and in supporting victims. Therefore, the fund is looking for strong applications from organisations that provide support in partnership/collaboration and where links can be made with the key areas of focus in the Police and Crime Plan, for example:

- those who are, or could be, a target for crime
- helping victims cope with the immediate impact of crime and recovery from the harm caused
- those who are, or could become, a target for cybercrime, human trafficking, child sexual abuse



SULSAR was awarded £16,745 from the PCC's Fund to purchase four hand-held thermal imaging cameras which are used in their searches for missing people.

- those who have drug and alcohol issues
- · reducing re-offending
- reducing anti-social behaviour.

You will need to demonstrate that you are:

- working in partnership/collaboration
- working with hard to reach groups
- filling gaps in services.

Outcomes and monitoring

All funding supported must show three clear measurable outcomes aligned to the Police and Crime Plan which will have to be reported on at the end of the grant funding.
