**SUBJECT: POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER'S ANNUAL GOVERNANCE STATEMENT 2020**

**SUMMARY:**

1. It is the responsibility of the Audit Committee to consider the corporate governance arrangements for the Police and Crime Commissioner and Chief Constable including reviewing their Annual Governance Statements.
2. The draft Police and Crime Commissioner's Annual Governance Statement for 2020 is now submitted to the Audit Committee for consideration in advance of its adoption by the Commissioner in readiness for the approval of the Commissioner's Statement of Accounts by the end of July 2020.
3. The Statement is a review of the effectiveness of the Commissioner's governance arrangements by reference to the Commissioner's Code of Corporate Governance.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

1. The Committee is requested to consider the Commissioner's draft Annual Governance Statement 2020 (attached at Appendix A).

## **DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION**

### **1. INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 Each year the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) and Chief Constable, as corporation soles, and thereby separate legal entities, must by virtue of the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2011, each produce Annual Governance Statements. A draft Annual Governance Statement has been prepared on behalf of the PCC for consideration (attached at Appendix A). The Annual Governance Statement provides the opportunity to review the effectiveness of the PCC's governance arrangements by reference to the Code of Corporate Governance.
- 1.2 The Annual Governance Statement must accompany the PCC's Statement of Accounts when they are approved.
- 1.3 The Annual Governance Statement is a key governance document and is now presented to the Committee for consideration prior to its approval and adoption by the PCC.
- 1.4 The statement remains a working draft. It is, in a number of respects, incomplete. It does not yet have the statement required from internal audit (in red on page 21) nor the final position on internal audits (in red on page 22), and the Financial Planning Statement (in red on pages 23-24).
