1	Is there a maximum amount we are able to bid for?	No, there is no maximum amount but we are obviously limited by what funding has been made available.  Please ensure you read the criteria as to eligible spend, and provide sufficient detail in the template to justify your request.
2	The link to the application spreadsheet on the website does not appear to work? Can you send it to me?	Yes we can email the application documentation. The link on the website has been checked and appears to work.
3	Can you explain what you mean by 'annual return' in the template?	Annual return is the terminology used by the MoJ in their template and means annual accounts. Please use the Suffolk Application Template from the PCC's website to complete your application and include your latest annual accounts with your submission.
4	Can delivery of a service to an individual (e.g. counselling) which commences before the end of October utilise the funding to continue to provide the service after this point?	No. Delivery and associated spend needs to be within the timeframe 24 March to 31 October.
5	Are we eligible for funding from Suffolk's OPCC as we are an organisation that has a National/Regional focus covered by multiple PCC authorities? Our application is for work for Suffolk for COVID 19 related support for Domestic Abuse victims.	As per the instructions on the <a href="#">PCC's website</a> you should read the MOJ guidance to see if you are eligible for the PCC's stream of funding.  The <a href="#">Home Office</a> released details of funding available for organisations where the supported victims are very geographically dispersed over multiple PCC areas, and/or no one PCC area is the clear base for the majority of victims.  We will consider all applications received against the MOJ guidance for eligibility and contact applicants with any clarification questions.
