- Details of the service(s)

<u>The Children and Young Persons Outreach (CAYPO)</u> Service supports the gap in services for children and young people as victims of Domestic Abuse. They support those aged 5-15 and provide group and 1-1 work alongside a non-abusive parent. The service is provided by Leeway Domestic Violence & Abuse Services, and support is county-wide.

<u>Alumah</u> is an organisation based in West Suffolk that offers specific support to children and young people affected by Domestic Abuse. They provide a trauma intervention programme.

No victims services exclusively for victims under 18 were commissioned in 2021/2022.

- The funding allocated to each service

In 2022/23, the <u>CAYPO Service</u> received £115,396, with the contract due to finish 31.03.2025. However, the service spent a total of £16,127 for the first year of the contract (22/23).

In 2022/23, Alumah received £6,500.
